



## Kurt Corey Tribute Scholarship Oregon State University

### Introduction

Kurt served as the Public Works Director at the City of Eugene for 16 years and was known nationally for his work with the American Public Works Association (APWA). Kurt was an active member of APWA, which in 2006 named him one of its top 10 leaders in the nation. The following year, he served as president of the state's chapter of the association and in 2010, he received the chapter's highest honor, the Bowes Award. He was passionate about excellent service delivery, and in 2004 he championed APWA's accreditation of Eugene Public Works, one of the first public agencies in the nation to earn this recognition. He was a great leader and friend who exemplified the public works profession through his dedication to the community and a deep sense of caring for his employees. Simply put, Kurt made a difference - to his community, his colleagues, and his friends. This scholarship recognizes Kurt's support of students with career goals in the field of public works.



### Eligibility

Students must meet the eligibility criteria below to be considered for the scholarship:

1. Full-time civil engineering students who will achieve junior standing at the beginning of the academic year of the award.
2. Students who receive the award during their junior year will again be eligible to apply for the award during their senior year, assuming they maintain eligibility for the scholarship.
3. United States citizen or legal U.S. resident.
4. Four-year resident of the state of Oregon preferred but qualified applicants considered.
5. Course work must be taken at the school where the scholarship is awarded.

### Procedure

1. Submit the following information to the applicant's school representative by no later than the due date:

- a. Application Form
- b. Copy of transcript

2. School faculty will review the applications and recommend one scholarship applicant to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration.

3. The APWA Scholarship Committee will review the recommendation and application materials for eligibility and completeness, then submit to the APWA Oregon Chapter Scholastic Foundation for consideration of award.
4. Scholarship award recipients will be notified by email. The notifications usually occur in late August/early September.

### **Distribution**

Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term.

### **CHANGE OF ADDRESS**

**Should the award recipient change their mailing address at any time during the school year, the scholarship committee needs to be notified as soon as possible to avoid any delay in the student receiving their scholarship funds.**

### **Chapter Conferences**

The scholarship recipient will be invited to attend either the fall or spring Chapter Conference to not only be recognized for their achievements but to also network with engineers and public works professionals from both the public and private sectors.

The fall conference is generally held in mid- to late October and the spring conference is generally held in early to mid-April. Registration fees will be covered for scholarship recipients by the Chapter

For in-person conferences, meals and lodging will also be included. It should be noted that lodging will be limited to one room for women and another room for men with a two-person per room maximum. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference, however, ride share opportunities may be available with other conference attendees.
