Since the Oregon APWA chapter started its scholarship program in 1981, 384 scholarships totaling \$621,200 have been awarded to students enrolled in a variety of public works academic disciplines, ranging from civil engineering to wastewater management.

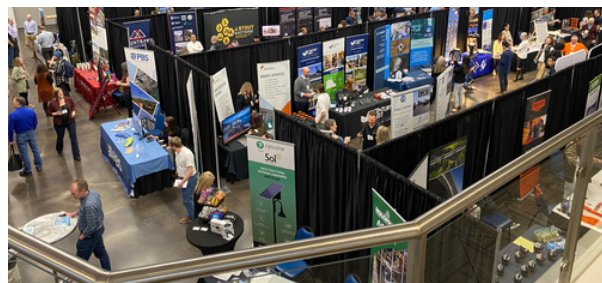
Scholarships also honor past Oregon public works leaders and serve to engage the members of Oregon APWA in supporting the next generation of public works professionals.

2026-2027 SCHOOL YEAR

The Oregon APWA Scholastic Foundation awarded a total of 22 scholarships totaling \$52,500 for the 2026 – 2027 school year.

To ensure every scholarship could be awarded, three were moved this year: the Veterans Scholarship shifted from the University of Portland to Oregon State University, and the Les Lyle Memorial and Dan Boss Drinking Water Scholarships were reallocated to Umpqua Community College after their original schools were unable to present candidates. The Les Lyle Memorial Scholarship, which went unawarded last year, was awarded this year as the committee had hoped.

Henry is studying Water Quality Treatment within Engineering and has a GPA of 3.86. His goal is to obtain a job in the water quality field.



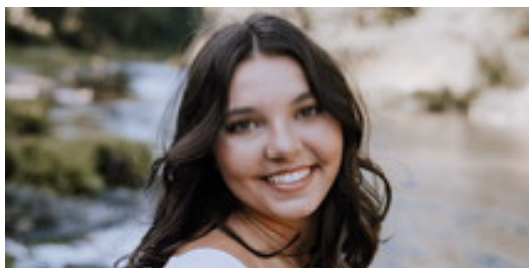
Lindsay Anne Tellegen
